Last week ... as recalled by Allen Horrell

The meeting was a buzz of activity with all our Pride of Workmanship awardees, their sponsors and supporters. 14 Awards this year is something of a record, so it was always going to be a longer than normal meeting, but with **Jan Cutler's** organisational ability behind the event, and **Geoff (Mike) Brennan** as Master of Ceremonies it was also going to run like a well-oiled machine. **President Ken** opened the meeting with a welcome to all then Rotary Grace was sung, and **Ron Thomson** proposed the loyal Toast to the Queen. The visitors took part in both rituals with enthusiasm, and comments were passed about how the formalities added dignity to our meeting. There were some brief announcements, the good news was that **Siddharth Maheshwari** is now a permanent resident of Australia, the bad news is that **Rayne** is leaving us, as reported in last week's Hub, courtesy of Cub Reporter **Kalma McLellan**, who did a superb job covering for me.

Victoria Blichfeldt gave her weekly report from Safari by Post card; and the Salvation Army thanked the Club and **Nora Etmekdjian** in particular for the Red Shield collection effort last week. After all the help we received from the James Ruse Interact members it was humbling to receive a letter of thanks from their president for letting them take part – there is a fine example of Service above Self for us.

Adrian Hallett called for volunteers to help clean up Tebbutt Lodge this Saturday from 9 -12 – a good old-fashioned working bee.

Charles Kilby called for his Graffiti Action Group to assemble this Sunday for the vital task of paint vandalism eradication. He also spruiked the Epping Club's Changeover on the 16th June, as the \$100 ticket price goes in part to support his CCA charity in its good works in the local community. If you have never heard Superintendent Deborah Wallace of the NSW Police speak, it is well worth the \$100 to hear her anecdotes of life in the force bring Law and order to Cabramatta in the bad old days, and in the Middle Eastern crime unit in more recent times.

The Pride of Workmanship awards began and as I listened to the sponsors and the awardees speak I was struck by just how appropriate the words "Pride of Workmanship" are. Some of the comments bear repeating:

- "I take pride in finding the best outcome for our clients."
- "It is easy to excel when you are part of a great team."
- "I wouldn't work at Ryde Hospital if I wasn't proud of our work."
- "I come to work each day to make things better in Ryde."
- "It must have been a hard decision choosing me from such a high achiever group at Eastwood LAC, but you got it right: I am the best!"
- "No, Ryde Toyota is the best!" according to MC Geoff Brennan.

I noted that our Eastwood Senior Fire-fighter **Guy Mangan** had volunteered for Urban Search and Rescue work in Christchurch after the earthquake, and that SES volunteer **Michael Canty** had worked out of State during the recent Brisbane floods.

And our three awardees from the Royal Rehabilitation centre have 58 years of service between them, in the Spinal injury, Aged Care and Brain Injury units. Their pride in their service to these patients in their time of need was obvious.

Some say we should split the Pride of Workmanship awards into two nights, one for emergency services, the other for employees of other companies and organisations in Ryde. For what it is worth, in my opinion we should keep it combined. There is something powerful in Police, SES, Council, Charity and Private Enterprise employees seeing each other all being rewarded for doing their jobs well. It would be a shame to lose that cross-pollination between all worthy Vocations. PP Geoff ended with an invitation for all awardees and sponsors to consider Rotary membership as something to aspire to.

Guest Speaker and General Manager of the City of Ryde **John Neish** spoke on how to create a culture of pride in an organisation, and just how hard that can be. You must set standards and enforce them, but the focus should be on catching people doing exceptional things and rewarding them for it, not on catching them doing the wrong thing and punishing them. The Leader's role should be to reward and encourage excellence and achievement in their teams, and this is critical: "Leaders fail first, and then Organisations fail."

Guests and members stood around talking for some time afterwards, but the meeting closed at 8:30pm, a creditable effort given the number of awardees.
