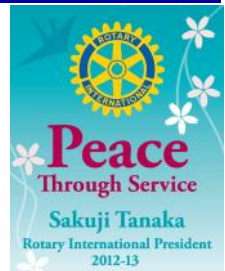

Dinner was Chicken Schnitzel smothered with gravy, accompanied by red capsicum, potatoes and beans, only slightly marred by the tasteless spongy pieces of squash.

President Burkhart announced the inauguration of the Meadowbank Combined Proboscis Club last week, with our President Elect Adrian Hallett elected President. Adrian will be a busy bloke next year.

Outbound Exchange student **John Goris** was presented with his RYEP Blazer next, so he is now outfitted for Finland. **PE Adrian Hallett** spoke on the graffiti removal on Sunday morning and the BBQ that follows. **Julie Thorp** has Conference registrations well under control, and deserves our thanks.

Eventually Duncan kicked off the session by chiding Kathryn Dodd for the Loyal Toast with a beer bottle thing, although there is nothing in the Rotary Manual of Procedures that specifically forbids an 'ocker' salute. Birthdays, wedding and club anniversaries were so much fodder for the fining machine, and on this night two noisy tables were first equal and both paid the piper.

David James introduced Phil Isaacs of ROMAC fame, to speak on the subject of low powered personal computers for third world communities in places like PNG. In a research project involving two TAFE's and a Chinese hardware manufacturer, they have produced a tiny, solid state PC in a box the size of a power supply, with no fans to suck dust into the workings, and with no moving parts, the LPPC can handle 95% humidity at 50°C.

At the end of his presentation **Patrick Longfield** asked the best question of the night: "Why do they need Computers at all?" Two countries which regularly score far higher than Australia in literacy and numeracy tests are Hong Kong and Singapore, which do not train their children to use computers, instead with text books and chalkboards, they teach them how to use their brains. I don't think that a dedicated teacher enthusiastically passing the torch of learning to another generation can ever be replaced by a computer, but sadly, many of our unionised, protected NSW teachers could be.

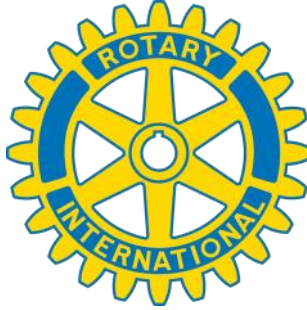
