



Last Meeting . . . as recalled by Allen Horrell

resident Burkhart started the meeting with 13 absent Rotarians, but we still had a respectable crowd and as PP Ross Rocca calculated, an 80% attendance after make-ups.

Dinner was served – chicken breast in gravy with sweet potato mash, carrots and broccoli. It was filling enough that I refused the dessert.

President Burkhart announced that we had a Board Meeting at the end of the meeting, then **Ken Allen** spoke on Foundation giving, and the difficulties in finding who in our club are currently financial with Centurion commitments. Bruce Allen will be attending the first meeting in March to explain the new Future Vision of TRF.

John Mazlin explained his long absence. He has been tied up with a long-running court case in Grafton, where he is an expert witness. President Burkhart wished him luck and hoped John would be free of this obligation soon.

David James told us our Paul Harris Fellow Lorraine Cox has now joined North Ryde Rotary Club. He also said he is arranging for us to attend a meeting at the Ryde TAFE Catering College some time in term 2. **President Burkhart** gave an impassioned endorsement of the 3pm food sale held each day there. Apparently it is so popular that he has to fight his way through queues of pensioners to get to the cheapest food in Ryde each day.

Ron Thomson spoke on the Golf day, reminding us that it is our second largest fundraiser, and marketed keys to his locked fridge full of wine donated by club members. The headline charity is again the Prostate Cancer Foundation, with \$50 from each registration going to this worthy cause, the balance to support 'community projects' of the Rotary Club of Ryde.

Bob Kaye-Smith reminded the meeting that next week is a working meeting to plan the Conference weekend manning and tasks so do your best to attend, and bring your partner. Julie Thorp told us we had nearly all paid for Conference and accommodation, and it is now 4 weeks till Conference.

Serjeant Duncan Taylor being absent, **Corporal David Johnston** asked Maureen Mulheron's daughter Kathleen to draw Ron Thomson's Spackle ticket, so that with the Joker remaining unfound, the Golf fridge got another bottle of wine. DG John Dodd was fined for using his phone during the meeting. Then being unable to identify the noisy table, David fined us all to make sure he got the guilty party! He then fined David James and Nora Etmekdjian for having gone on a cruise - talk about the pot calling the kettle black!

In the cross-fines, I fined all members who have ever been on a cruise - \$1 for each cruise they have been on, and our Corporal immediately declared himself a gold coin bankrupt!

Patrick Longfield introduced Mark Anderson standing in front of a PowerPoint slide that said 'Grow your Membership'. Mark had researched Ryde or at least the 2112 postcode, and calculated that we should be able to find 50 members per 10,000 of population, which would give us 139 members in the Rotary Club of Ryde. He didn't explain how we would fit them in at our meeting venue.

He made the point that recruitment is not a problem - 1.2 million new recruits have joined RI in the last decade. Unfortunately 1.2 million have died, retired, or just left the organisation over the same period. It is retention of that last group that appears to be the area we need to improve. As DG John Dodd pointed out, 30% of new recruits leave in the second or third year of their membership. Arguably they were valid recruits who decided Rotary was not meeting their needs.

Geoff Nix suggested exit interviews be conducted and analysed. Mark Anderson said "The singing of Rotary Grace must go!" **John Mazlin** rose and gave a rousing defence of the Rotary Grace as a unifying and uplifting start to our meetings – long may it continue!

Steve Thorp thanked Mark and then we closed the meeting in what was no doubt regarded as a hackneyed way, singing the National Anthem is every bit as abhorrent to some people as the Rotary Grace.

I have been unable to find any correlation between dumping club traditions and growing membership, and there is a saying I reminded Mark of, about babies being thrown out with the bath-water. While we must regularly review our meeting procedures and traditions, it does not necessarily follow that the old must be abandoned for the fashionable new. As a wise man once told me, an old fool says "This is old, so it must be good". A young fool says "This is new, so it must be better!" I congratulate John Mazlin for his defence of our Rotary traditions.

RICHMOND GOLF CLUB

· TEMPORARY RULES. 1940

- Players are asked to collect Bomb and Shrapnel splinters to save these causing damage to the Mowing Machines.
- In Competitions, during gunfire or while bombs are falling, players may take cover without penalty for ceasing play.
- The positions of known delayed action bombs are marked by red flags at a reasonably, but not guaranteed, safe distance therefrom.
- 4. Shrapnel and/or bomb splinters on the Fairways, or in Bunkers within a club's length of a ball, may be moved without penalty, and no penalty shall be incurred if a ball is thereby caused to move accidentally.
- A ball moved by enemy action may be replaced, or if lost or destroyed, a ball may be dropped not nearer the hole without penalty.
- A ball lying in a crater may be lifted and dropped not nearer the hole, preserving the line to the hole, without penalty.
- A player whose stroke is affected by the simultaneous explosion of a bomb may play another ball from the same place. Penalty one stroke.

Personal Data

Swim Marathon to Mark Rotary's 108th Anniversary

housands of participants around the world plan to swim 100 meters or more on **23 February** in a global swimming event that is just one of many activities celebrating Rotary's 108th anniversary.

The global event is being organized by the Rotary Club of Grantham, Lincolnshire, England, which has held an annual swim fundraiser to support local charities since 1990. Participants swim laps in a pool to earn pledged money during the "swimarathons."

Last year, in addition to their local event, the Grantham Rotarians decided to spearhead a worldwide swim the week of Rotary's anniversary, in an effort to set a new world record. Guinness World Records officially recorded 4,546 participants ages 8 to 93 synchronizing their 100-meter swims to the exact same hour across 15 time zones. The effort raised more than US\$100,000 for polio eradication.

This year, the organizers are hoping to create the biggest same-day global swimming event and are inviting clubs to hold swimming fundraisers throughout the day, with proceeds going to PolioPlus and local club-supported charities. Already, more than 180 clubs in 43 countries on six continents have signed up.

Paul Wilson, one of the event's two coordinators, says his most gratifying Rotary moment came last year, watching 14-year-old Moin Junnedi, India's youngest national Paralympian, complete his swim.

"Junnedi suffers from a severe brittle bones condition which has meant he's suffered with over 200 fractures during his young life," says Wilson. "Just a day or two before this swim. he suffered four fractures, but was so

determined to take part. It was pure inspiration."
