

DGE Ian Scott opened the Zone meeting by acknowledging **PDGs Alex Sawyer** and **John Dodd**. Phil Isaacs toasted Australia, Denmark and France in honour of our exchange students, and then **President Adrian Hallett** as host President toasted Rotary International, with a wide-ranging speech in praise of Rotary and especially of Polio Plus.

District Governor Graeme Davies addressed the crowd of over 80 Rotarians and Partners, and then introduced **David Hart**, the Blue Mountains Interplast man. An Interplast raffle was on each table and we were encouraged to take part, hearing the story of a how a child from the Philippines with a cleft palate was cured by plastic surgery.

Adrian's "5 minutes of fame" came before the other Presidents' turn to report on their clubs' activities. Adrian reminded the crowd of how Ryde ran the last Conference for District 9680, and of our Afghanistan schools project, acknowledging our partnership with the Indigo Foundation. He quoted Sally Stevenson's address at conference where she spoke of the un-looked for outbreak of peace in the areas of Hazarajat where we had built our schools. Cooperation between the tribes on the school building program had led to wider cooperation on other issues, building friendships and trust. Back in Ryde we work to eradicate graffiti in our neighbourhood.

After a break to enjoy fellowship along with dinner, **Claire Holloway** from Gladesville rose to explain that her club, with only 15 members had decided to "Bring back the Barbeque!" to raise money and public awareness of their existence.

Philip Sigglekow from Hunters Hill was kind enough to comment that he credits the example of Ryde Rotary for inspiring him to join Rotary. The Pier Hotel sponsors their Golf Day, and they plan to fill 120 tables at their Business Networking dinner.

Michael O'Brien reported that Macquarie Park Rotary still meet at Vogue Café at 7:30am for an hour every Tuesday – That's Shop 60 Level 1 Macquarie Shopping Centre, North Ryde. They support RYLA, have a healthy Rotaract Club, and run Carols by Candlelight in cooperation with North Ryde Rotary Club, to raise money for ROMAC. They plan a Hope Africa Gala dinner to raise \$500,000 to build a community centre in Namibia. "How come we built a 1000 pupil school in Afghanistan for only \$88,000?" I wondered, did the Namibian builders see them coming?

Phil Isaacs' North Ryde club has 28 members but 10 are associate members who don't attend meetings. One meeting per month is devoted to education on Rotary. They run a Trivia night each March, and support their Rotaract Club's Trivia night on August 17th as well, encouraging the Riverside zone clubs to do the same.

DG Graeme Davies began his speech by acknowledging Ryde for hosting the event and casting doubt on Wahroonga Rotary Club's claim to be the pre-eminent Club in District 9685, after being hosted by Ryde.

He told us "Megatrends" were coming, and so was the Rotary International Convention this year, urging us to register now or at least before December 15! He described RIP Ron Burton's theme of "Engage Rotary" as being about the "Rotary moment" when a person moves from being a member of a Rotary Club to being a Rotarian. This sounded

profound till I realised that one was the definition of the other! Graeme described the culture of the new District 9685 as being one of respect, listening, helping, and the end to the District/Club divide. Pride in being a Rotarian combined with the fun of being one.

He then told us our new district owns the Hawkesbury River and that it is superior in every way to the Rhine and Mississippi rivers! **IPP Burkhart Foertsch** nearly choked as the castles, cathedrals and other wonders along Europe's most beautiful river, and most important waterway, the Rhine, were written off as inferior to a largely undeveloped backwater infested by puffer fish.

Perhaps hyperbole is the norm for District Governors: no megatrend there, but a 3% membership increase for the District would be a good one, if we can bring it off in his year. RI trained peacemakers may be the next one we notice finally bringing peace to our world: He asked us to imagine "A world beyond War, built by Rotarians!" The last time John Lennon asked us a similar question, he was shot dead by a lunatic fan. Perhaps only Rotary can "Give Peace a Chance"?

The Rotary International Committee for Enhancement Of the Rotary Brand for some reason made me think of a ball of rice, but was supposed to bring to mind the brand new slogan: "Community Service on a Global Scale!" He finished the meeting with the invocation "The best years of Rotary are still to come!"

It was a great night, a gala event with a feel somewhere between a Pride of Workmanship evening and a District Conference. The family of Rotary was evidenced by the warmth of feeling in the room, even if we did run a little over time.

Rotary International granted the Charter on April 22, 1946, (Club No. 6268, later changed to 18309). It is from that date that there was full recognition and membership in Rotary. Charter Night was held in the Ryde Town Hall on July 6, assembly being at 6.00 p.m., and as the program bears out, it was indeed a memorable occasion. Not only was there a tine gathering of Rotarians and distinguished guests, but a grand display of Rotary spirit, and excellent addresses expounding the true nature of the movement.

The highlights came when Chairman Tony Cameron presented the Charter Members to District Governor Harold Jones, and asked him to formally hand over the Charter. Following the presentation he said: "I have much pleasure in handing to you, President Eric, this Charter of the Rotary Club of Ryde. It is to be handed on to your successor under the same conditions as it is handed to you tonight. You have been elected to the highest office in the club, and much is expected of you, for Leadership in Rotary is vital to success. The newly inducted members have been handed copies of the Objects of Rotary, and the spirit of these Objects must go into every one of you. You are professional and businessmen, meeting together in Fellowship. You are united in the practice of Service. You are to have deep concern for the welfare of your neighbours, and your influence must be for good throughout the world..."


You need a Working With Children Check! There are 4 steps to the process:

1. Register online at www.check.kids.nsw.gov.au



At the bottom under "For Individuals", click "Apply"

Complete all fields including selecting "Purpose for check" of "Clubs or Other bodies..." as below:



You will be emailed a confirmation of your application which looks like this:

Working With Children Check - Application Receipt Your application for a Working With Children Check has been successfully lodged. Your Application Number is: APP0054164. To complete your application you must attend a NSW Motor Registry or Government Access Centre (locations listed on the NSW Working With Children Check website) by 14/01/2014 to

- 2. Take this notice to your local RTA centre together with the identification form you nominated Drivers Licence / ID card. Staff at the RTA will confirm you are the person in the notice.
- **3.** A few hours later you will be emailed a confirmation letter that your application has been processed, which includes a **WWC number** on letterhead like this:

RYPEN APPLICATIONS

For the first time, there will be TWO RYPEN Camps each year in District 9685. They will be held:
