Our two guests from our new **Ryde Secondary College Interact Club** spoke next. **President Laurence Unguroiu** and **Vice President Carina Mehta** spoke on their main cause for the year, raising funds for the Little Angels orphanage in Uganda, to sponsor individual students' education from kindergarten to year 6, at a cost of \$500 per child.

They have 10 separate fundraisers planned for the year to raise a target of \$3000 to \$4000 in this first year of operation. They have 40 members, mostly in years 7-10, and were keen to assist providing manpower at Ryde Rotary projects. I was very impressed with these two young people, who I thought were a credit to their School.

Exchange Student Lucile is now staying with **John and Janelle Dod**d, which means she now takes the train to school. She still finds the teachers hard to understand, but is learning: "When they say 'Straya', it means 'Australia'," she explained to **Duncan**. **PE Kalma** spruiked the Child Protection registration, warning that we should get on with it before the website inevitably collapses!

I announced a Community Committee meeting to be held after our club meeting on the 27th August. **Vocational Chair Martin Aston** reported that **Angie** had returned in Triumph (rather than in an Aston Martin) from the World Dragon boat championship, bearing 2 Gold, 2 Silver and one Bronze medal. The club congratulated Angie and plotted that next time we are asked to man a dragon boat on the Parramatta River we'll ask Angie to supply a team of ring-ins that we can supply with Ryde shirts for the day!

Geoff was off sick so **PP Duncan Taylor** returned to his old post. He arranged for **Carina** to draw **Kathryn Dodd's** ticket, but in spite of repeated shuffling, she drew the King of Hearts, not the Joker. **Julie** was fined for announcing **Tony Abboud's** absence when he was sitting at the next table, and after a bit of gratuitous racial vilification we moved on to fine **Kalma**, who fired straight back, extracting a gold coin from the Serjeant.


You need a Working With Children Check! There are 4 steps to the process:

1. Register online at www.check.kids.nsw.gov.au



At the bottom under "For Individuals", click "Apply"

Complete all fields including selecting "Purpose for check" of "Clubs or Other bodies..." as below:



You will be emailed a confirmation of your application which looks like this:

Working With Children Check - Application Receipt Your application for a Working With Children Check has been successfully lodged. Your Application Number is: APP0054164. To complete your application you must attend a NSW Motor Registry or Government Access Centre (locations listed on the NSW Working With Children Check website) by 14/01/2014 to

- 2. Take this notice to your local RTA centre together with the identification form you nominated Drivers Licence / ID card. Staff at the RTA will confirm you are the person in the notice.
- **3.** A few hours later you will be emailed a confirmation letter that your application has been processed, which includes a **WWC number** on letterhead like this:



4. Forward this email to Kalma so she can register you as a volunteer at Ryde Rotary. Please talk to Kalma if you have any questions!

"...Standards must be raised, and if this is to be done, there must be no member without a job in community service. Rotary has always been keenly interested in youth and its problems, and it regards the education and training of young people as of great importance. These tasks are fraught with great difficulties, but do not let them deter you. Let us all to the task."

In reply, **President Eric** said: "It is an honour and a privilege to accept this charter. This is a proud moment for us all, for Ryde and for this club. Surely it is not insignificant that we should receive this charter this week — the week when America is commemorating its courage and its victory and holding the world enthralled with feats of terrible power and destruction. At 8 o'clock last Monday, the world moved into a new era — the Atomic Age. May I ask," what is it?" Surely it is that Man has extended his power over all things. So it is in this age that the Rotary Club of Ryde has begun. And I will draw this analogy — just as Man has by his genius and industry released a physical energy undreamed of, so let us release from our personalities a great spiritual energy such as can come only from a Divine motive. Let us go on to the fulfilment of our Rotary ideals, remembering that in this age, of great material marvels, the realities and true worth of life lie with the spirit."
