

After **Ron Taffa** led us in the Loyal Toast, **President Adrian** welcomed our guests, and Kate explained the survey and asked us to fill it in immediately during the meeting. Impressively, most members had complied by the end of the night. **Bob Kaye-Smith** arrived late, filling in for the absent **Tony Abboud**, perhaps.

Adrian called for RYLA nominations, and spruiked the Ryde River Festival, before PP Graham Metcalfe showed us the 2013/14 "Blue Book" Club directory, which was then distributed to members. This is a service he has provided for the club for untold years, and should be commended for. He also reported that Rtn Surinder Joson was home from hospital, and needs someone to mow his lawns. "I'll do it!" called PP Burkhart Foertsch. "He'll work for Schnapps!" called another. PP Peter Cooper ran through the attendance numbers for the Fellowship dinner on Friday, another successful Social project handled with his usual attention to detail.

Lucile took the lectern to comment that the first 6 weeks of her Youth Exchange have passed swiftly, and to say that Sunday was "A perfect day, sailing Sydney Harbour on **PDG John Dodd**'s yacht with a group of other exchange students."


You need a Working With Children Check! There are 4 steps to the process:

1. Register online at www.check.kids.nsw.gov.au



At the bottom under "For Individuals", click "Apply"

Complete all fields including selecting "Purpose for check" of "Clubs or Other bodies..." as below:



You will be emailed a confirmation of your application which looks like this:

Working With Children Check - Application Receipt Your application for a Working With Children Check has been successfully lodged. Your Application Number is: APP0054164. To complete your application you must attend a NSW Motor Registry or Government Access Centre (locations listed on the NSW Working With Children Check website) by 14/01/2014 to

- 2. Take this notice to your local RTA centre together with the identification form you nominated Drivers Licence / ID card. Staff at the RTA will confirm you are the person in the notice.
- **3.** A few hours later you will be emailed a confirmation letter that your application has been processed, which includes a **WWC number** on letterhead like this:



4. Forward this email to Kalma so she can register you as a volunteer at Ryde Rotary. Please talk to Kalma if you have any questions!

The Rotary Club of Ryde has a fine collection of Rotary insignia and general equipment, and it might be well to record how it all came about. As already stated, many items were received on Charter Night when it is customary for gifts to be made to new clubs.

The sponsor club of Burwood presented the President's Collar and Jewel, and the Rotary Wheel and Plinth. The Speaker's Gong came from the Rotary Club of Sydney, the Gavel from Bondi, the Flags from Hurstville, the Shillelagh from North Sydney, the Clock from Katoomba, and the framed copy of the Objects of Rotary from Parramatta. Manly gave a photo of His Majesty, King George VI, but this of course is not used. Soon after the charter was granted the large Rotary Banner was presented by **Cliff Lovett**. It is a lovely piece of work, done by his mother by hand when she was over eighty years of age.

Later on, **Harold Halvorsen** provided the Equipment Cupboard, and **Bob O'Toole** the Honour Boards. **Ron Pacey** gave the Badge Cabinet during **Bob Maze**'s year. The Rotary Club of Ryde, Isle of Wight, donated the President's Tankard that was on show at all meetings in 1949, in appreciation of our association with it and also for the gifts of food parcels sent in the post-war years.

The (original) Floor Rug that welcomes you to Rotary each week was given by **Captain Frank Sawtell**. Frank was a pilot with Ansett-ANA and an honorary member for some years and did a great deal in many ways. He was particularly helpful in tours and transport, and loved to help the young people. He retired to the Central Coast, and the rug was his parting gift. Another item of furniture, a folding stack-away traymobile, designed by Ron Pacey and presented to the Club in Bob Maze's year, was used from 1959.

AN HISTORICAL SUMMARY OF THE ROTARY CLUB OF RYDE

1946-47 President: Eric Hearnshaw

This was, as you would expect, a period of consolidation, members getting to know each other and to know Rotary. Times were hard. Catering was difficult to arrange, attendances were often poor as it was not easy to make up, and there was a post-war uncertainty that worked very much against good planning. Servicemen were being demobbed in great numbers, the housing position had become acute, and there was in some quarters a fear that the conditions following World War I would return. But the Burwood Club had done its work well, and placed Rotary in safe hands.

Charter President Eric was a man of great personal integrity and standing. He was a decorated soldier, a member of State Parliament, a successful businessman in his own right and a man of ideas who was in strong public demand as a speaker and advisor. A fine team supported him, so the future of Rotary was never in doubt. At this stage, it was important that the meetings should be bright, and worthwhile in interest and information, and here the first Program Director Mal Pilcher did a grand job. The first inter-club visit was to the newly chartered South Sydney Club on November 18, 1946, when the President with Vice-President Eric Somerville and seven members made the visit and presented a clock. This visit was returned on July 14, of the following year, the

occasion being a Ladies' Night. The Club's first Ladies' Night had been held quite a time before, on December 17, 1946, and as one would expect, it caused quite a social flutter. It was a memorable and exciting gathering, the Ladies having their first experience of Rotary, and enjoying it very much.



At this time international affairs were very much in the news, and the International Committee Chairman Bob Beer soon made contact with the United Nations Association, and began the project for Food Parcels for Britain. To support this, many functions were held and provided enough money to enable the Club to send parcels regularly. In July 1947, Mal Pilcher suggested sending a food parcel to the Rotary Club of Ryde in the Isle of Wight, to be given to the member whose birthday was nearest to the date of receipt. This was done, and by a strange coincidence, Rotarian Harold Halvorsen was present at the meeting over there, when the parcel was received and presented. Ironically, it went to a grocer.

The uncertainty of the times is seen in many recorded incidents. Early in 1947, the meeting place was changed to the Ryde Bowling Club, and there was quite a stir when the dinner fee was raised from 3/6 to 4/-, and it was suggested that unless the members gave the Secretary two days' notice of impending absence, they should pay the dinner fees.

Paul Harris, the Founder of Rotary, died in June 1947, and the proposed memorial to him brought an immediate response from Ryde Club. So it was that in the following August Ryde began its membership of The Rotary Foundation, a project which has ever since been a strong feature of the Club.

Right from the start, there was a sound development of the Club fellowship, which has always been so pleasing. The first Fellowship Chairman, Harry Davies, was largely responsible for this, setting the pattern in the manner of the great Rotarian that he was. He, too, organised the first transport for the Crippled Children to their club in the city, a service maintained for many years.
