## BOWELCARE REPORT

The Rotary Club of East Gosford commenced this program in 1990 and our Club has been involved every year since. I believe this is the 24th report to the Club. BowelCare Australia has been able to maintain the cost of the kits at \$10 for the last 6 years that I have been associated.

In spite of the common belief in the community that this test is not required every year, I am pleased to report that the response this year was 461 kits - almost the same as last year's 468 kits. Total sales this year was \$4,610. This simple test can detect possible irregularities in the functioning of our fuel and exhaust system.

As you know, BowelCare requires voluntary involvement by both the 13 participating pharmacies and our Club, and there are no monetary gains to our Club - it is a "not for profit" project.

I believe that any project that Rotary is involved in (particularly within the community) increases understanding and credibility of Rotary, and increases the possibility of gaining new members. This year we commenced this program a little later than in previous years, advertising was almost nil and the BowelCare signage in the pharmacies was well obscured by products telling us how to live forever.

I will be retiring from this position in the new Rotary year. My thanks to Ron Taffa and Charles Kilby for assisting me with the collection of the returned kits at West Ryde & Top Ryde City.

PP Bob Kaye-Smith was invited to toast the Queen, and Adrian welcomed all to the 69th Ryde Rotary Changeover: an opportunity to reflect upon the history of our great Club and the achievements of the past year. Special guests Laurie & Hele Van Ryn, our regular staff at Next Gen Emily Bryant, the wonderful wives & partners of Ryde Rotary, the Hallett Ian, plus a host of Rotaractors and McLellans heartily supporting incoming President Kalma were all welcomed.

Following the toast to Rotary International by PDG John Dodd and response by PP Rob Mitchell, those spouses, partners, significant others and hangerers on were toasted by PP Duncan Taylor, and kindly responded to by Linda Hallett.

Some special presentations were made, and Adrian presented a huge bouquet to Val Payne, and thanked her for many years of service, first playing the piano for the regular Club sing-a-longs and later providing the pre-meeting nibblyies each week. Emily from Next Generations was also presented with flowers, for ensuring our weekly gatherings run smoothly at our regular venue, and for her hard work & pleasant company.



President Adrian then made his final remarks as President:

*“Thank you all for joining me here tonight as we celebrate another year in the history of the Rotary Club of Ryde. None of this would be possible without you, the members of the Club. I would like also to acknowledge the support we receive from our wives, husbands, partners, significant others and members of our great Rotary family.*

*My year as President has been challenging and rewarding. We have achieved a lot with members committing to our regular activities including Paint Vandalism Removal, our Bunnings BBQ’s, Anzac Day at Tebbutt Lodge, Mothers and Fathers Day visits, Meals on Wheels to mention but a few. Our Fellowship gatherings for dinner at Ryde Parramatta Golf Club and our weekend away at Gerringong would not be possible without Peter Cooper and Ron Taffa*

*We have witnessed Rotary’s flagship International Convention being held in Sydney and the opportunities it has presented to meet fellow Rotarians from around the world.*

*I thank you all for your support during my year and trust you will continue your support for President Elect Kalma when she assumes the role later this evening.”*



PP David James announced a long list of end-of-year donations by the Club, and President Adrian continued the giving, announcing the 2013-14 end of year awards.

Laurie Van Ryn, Principal at Eastwood Heights Public School, was presented with a Paul Harris Fellowship for his commitment to supporting and educating his students

above and beyond academics. Laurie has provided fantastic support for our Junior Schools Public Speaking Competition, and we look forward to seeing more of him in Rotary in years to come.

PP Bob Kaye-Smith was also presented with a Paul Harris Fellowship, and another sapphire for his pin. At the end of a record-breaking 5 year stint as Club Secretary, in addition to his consistent effort and support of President Adrian & the Board, Bob has been District Vocational Service Chair for many years, and his outstanding work earned him the Rotary International Vocational Service Award in 2013.



No Club can operate without members and it is these members who commit totally to the cause that make that Club successful by attending all the regular meetings then backing up for other Club activities. President Adrian recognised several members with a certificate for 100% attendance in 2013-14: Bill Payne, Val Payne, Graham Metcalfe, John Dodd, Steve Thorp, Julie Thorp and President Adrian himself.

Ron Pacey was a Charter member of the Ryde Rotary Club. In 1960–61 he was also Club President. In 1996 (during the Clubs 50th anniversary year) the Rotary Club decided to honour Ron with the Ron Pacey Shield for Merit. This shield is presented by the President to recognise a club member who has provided meritorious service to the club.

Acknowledging that this year's recipient is a relatively new member but has lived under a Rotary umbrella her whole life, President Adrian had Acting Serjeant Duncan haul a flabbergasted Kathryn Dodd to be presented the shield. Kathryn joined the Club in August 2012, undertook the roles of Membership Director and Hub Editor in 2013-14, and helps out at Bunnings & Graffiti Removal when possible. In addition to all her usual work and co-curricular commitments, this year Kathryn decided to take on an Ultra Half Marathon along the Great Ocean Road to raise money for Cure Cancer Australia & the Rotary campaign to End Polio Now, raising over \$8,500.

The Lucky Door Prize first place was won by Margaret Cooper, and second prize by Ken Allen. There was some questioning of the integrity of the system when event co-ordinator Julie Thorp's husband Steve won first prize in the raffle, followed by David James in second place and Ian Henderson winning final pick of the hampers & wine pack on offer.

The outgoing Board members and Committee Chairs were presented with tokens of appreciation from President Adrian & Linda Hallett: Kalma McLellan, Bob Kaye-Smith, David James, Ken Allen, Kathryn Dodd, Martin Aston, Siddharth Maheshwari, Charles Kilby, Geoff Nix & John Dodd.



During dessert we were treated to an incredible musical tribute to our Exchange Student Lucile by Rtn Stefan Sojka, in the style of Little Richard. There was much laughter and applause - Stefan even managed to fit Les Sables D'Olonne into a rhyme! The Club has had a great year with Lucile and she will be missed.



Acting Serjeant Duncan Taylor returned the Staff and Charter, and President Adrian Hallett inducted our new President, Kalma McLellan.

Kalma took the opportunity to thank Past President Adrian for his contribution and hard work over the last year, with his wife Linda.

The Staff and Charter were presented to Serjeant-at-Arms PP Patrick Longfield, the new Board introduced and presented their pins, and President Kalma invited the Club to welcome in the new Rotary year, to embrace change, continue our good works, and work together to Light Up Rotary.

**JUNE 10 - AS RECALLED BY ALLEN HORRELL**

As **President Adrian Hallett** was later to comment, **Serjeant Geoff** was laid up "with a crook foot", so **Acting Serjeant Duncan** opened the meeting, only a couple of minutes late. We had a much reduced attendance of only 29 at the meeting, and four of them were visitors. Our guest speaker **Lynda Ben-Menashe** of the NSW Jewish Board of Deputies was introduced, then the dinner was served, a delicious but somewhat inappropriate pork steak with mashed kumara and broccoli.

**PDG John Dodd** appealed for more volunteers for the Bunnings BBQ this weekend with the inspiring statement that neither he nor **President Adrian** were able to attend this time around. **David James** spoke on behalf of **Julie Thorp**, also on the sick list with a damaged knee, whom he described as being fitted for a Zimmer frame, before circulating the Club Changeover and the District Changeover attendance sheets. He then called for urgent final reports for the Changeover programme.

**PP Rob Mitchell** rose to give us the good news that **Sally Stevenson of Indigo Foundation** fame has been honoured with an Order of Australia in the Queen's Birthday honours list. He also reminded us that the Ryde Signature dinner is both our new fundraiser and a significant social event for Ryde: we need to support this inaugural

event so that there are Ryde Rotarians in attendance to mix with the local businessmen and women, so they will know it is a Rotary-run evening.

Finally Rob spoke of Lindsay May's appeal for more money for the Rotary Foundation before the end of the financial year, so you can claim it back from the Taxman. If you are not a Centurion yet, you should climb aboard this movement: for \$2 per week, it is cheap as chips, but does our bit for our charity of choice.

President Adrian read a few more notices, then got down to the serious business of introducing Lucile Richard. In the last week, she had attended Rotary Convention, carried a flag in the opening Plenary sessions, been whale watching with **PP Martin Aston**, and had her school athletics day cancelled due to rain. President Adrian Hallett also took her to see a Steam Train race. At the conclusion of her report he presented her with a parting gift from the Club - a voucher to go on a Bridge Climb this weekend.

**Panos Marlassi** from Tebbutt Lodge was nominated by Sarah for a belated Pride of Workmanship award, presented by President Adrian, better late than never!

**PP Rob Mitchell** had the winning ticket in the spackle, but not the winning way with the deck of cards, retiring from the field with a mere Merlot. **Serjeant Duncan** fined all and sundry in a proud return to the ruthless ways of yesteryear, reversing all of Geoff's attempts to soften the role in a single night. **Rob Mitchell** was fined at least three times, and **Hendo** was so persecuted he forgot to curse Duncan's chooks.

**Lynda Ben-Menashe** of the NSW Jewish Board of Deputies then spoke on the history of the Jewish people. "Repairing the World" is a core part of the Jewish religion, and Lynda pointed out that Rotary does exactly the same thing, "Doing Good in the World". She described herself as having "the international wog look" while her sister looked more like a Cossack than a person of Mediterranean appearance. Her point was that Jews are not a race: Jewish people are multicultural, and consist of every ethnic group, although she did claim to be descended from Jesus Christ's next-door neighbours in ancient Israel. She described the contribution made by Jewish immigrants to Australia: they have served as soldiers, doctors, lawyers and judges, businessmen and artists.

In return they and their children have been threatened with violence and 18 Synagogues have been fire-bombed in the last 20 years in Australia. Racism is still a problem, to the extent that Jewish schools must have guards to protect the children, even here in Australia. Think about that, and how it would make you feel, if those were your kids. Lynda answered many questions, some quite pointed, with good humour, composure and a deep knowledge of her subject. On the Palestinian conflict, she said that they no longer hoped for a final lasting peace, just for a controlled, reduced conflict.

One of the more banal questions was from me: "Did you attend the Rotary Convention last week?" The purpose of this question was revealed when PP Steve Thorp presented her with the "G'Day from Sydney" Humanity in Motion volume three book from the Convention show-bags.

We sang our Anthem and then helped the Serjeant pack away for another week.

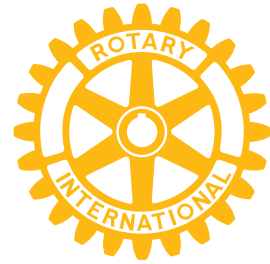
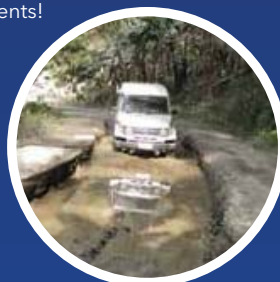
### About Timor L'este Dental Program

The Timor L'este Dental Program was founded in 2003 with the establishment of a dental clinic in Maubara. Working closely with the Carmelite Sisters, the program is aimed at assisting the rural Timorese population who have no way of accessing dental services in Dili.

Registered within the Rotary Australia World Community Service (project #110/2004-05), the program provides tax deductibility for our donors and aims to provide 4-6 dental team visits a year. The most recent team visit carried out 310 examinations, 332 extractions, 135 fillings and 87 preventative treatments - a total of 886 treatments!

Your support and donation will provide valuable funds to help improve the dental health of people in Timor L'este. The money will be partly used to purchase a Toyota Troop Carrier to transport the dental volunteers and portable dental equipment through 5 districts in Timor L'este, a country of 1.1 million people but only 10 dentists.

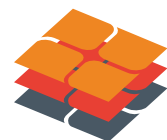

### TEST FOR LAST WEEK : SOLUTION

You have a pile of 24 coins. Twenty-three of these coins have the same weight, and one is heavier.

Your task is to determine which coin is heavier and do so in the minimum number of weighings.

You are given a beam balance (scale), which will compare the weight of any two sets of coins out of the total set of 24 coins.

How many weighings are required to identify the heavier coin?

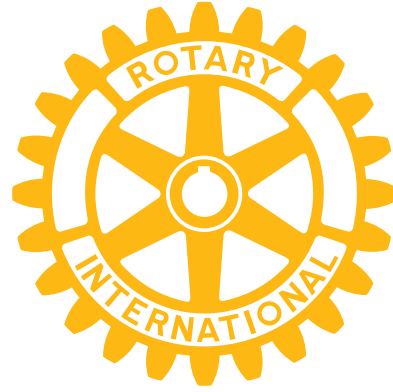
It can be done in three weighings.

Weighing 1: Break the coins into three piles of eight. Weigh one group of eight against another group of eight. If the scale balances, then the group that hasn't been weighed has the heavier coin. If the scale tips, then that group contains the heavier coin.

Weighing 2: Break the group of eight that has the heavier coin into three groups (three coins, three coins, and two coins). Weigh one set of three against the other set of three. If it balances, the group of two has the heavier coin. If the scale tips, then that group has the heavier coin.

Weighing 3: If the heavier coin is in the group of two, then just weigh one coin against the other to determine the heaviest coin. If the heavier coin is in a group of three, then take two of those coins and weigh them against each other. If the scale balances, the coin that hasn't been weighed is the heavier coin. If the scale tips, then that is the heavier coin.
