It has 70 Clubs and approximately 2,700 members.

This Club is a very active one, undertaking a wide range of projects and activities and support a selected range of charities and causes, as well as supporting the work of the Rotary Foundation. Their projects include: fundraising & community activities through an annual Art Show, an annual Golf Day, and running their BBQ trailer at local community events; Youth Camps including RYPEN, MUNA, RYLA & a School Awards Program; the "Let's Read" program to promote early reading, the "L to P" program to give disadvantaged youth the opportunity to learn to drive & obtain a drivers licence; and international projects including the New Hope School in Cambodia, and the School of St Jude in Tanzania, and Rotary Youth Exchange.

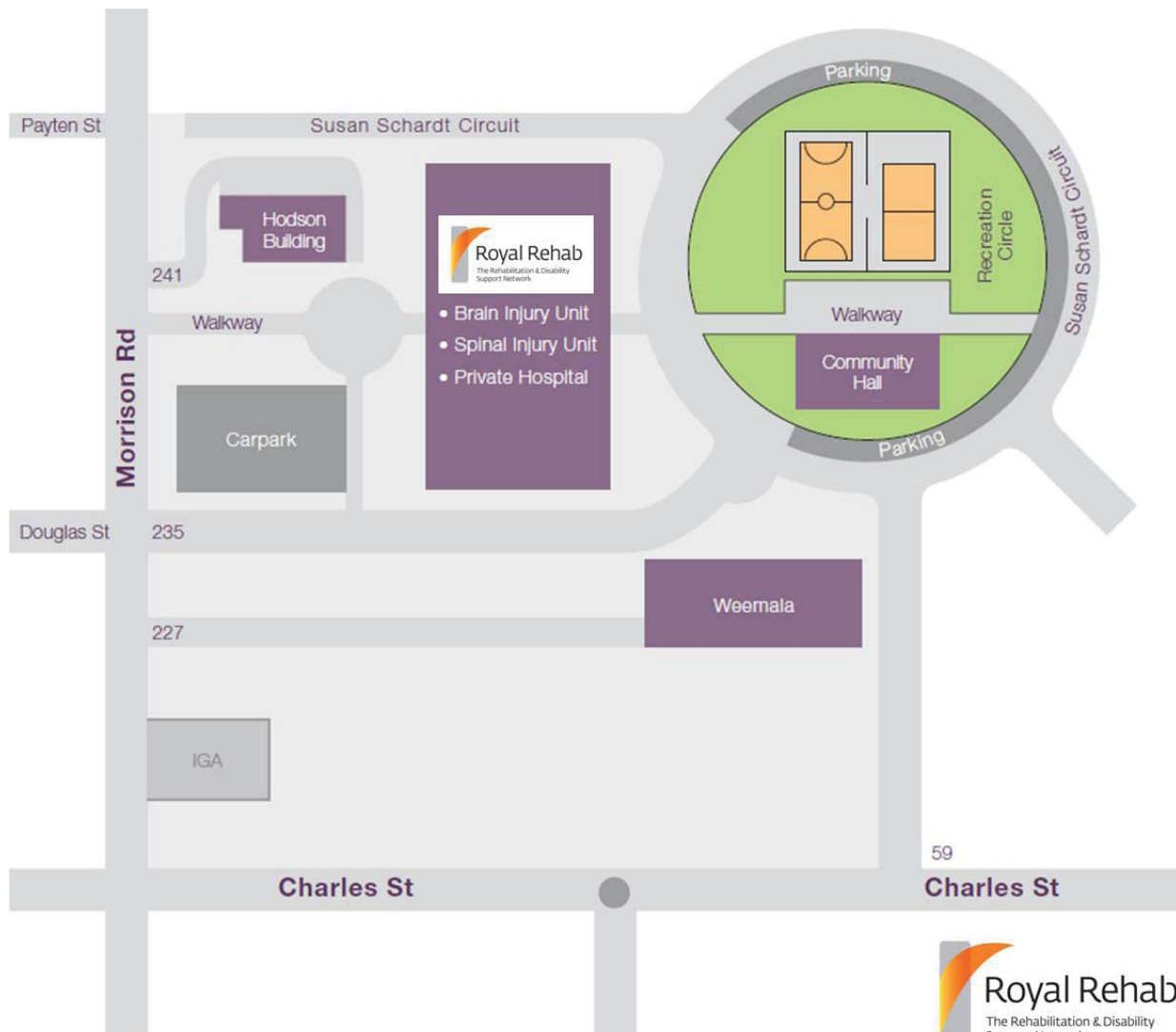

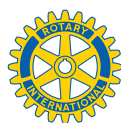

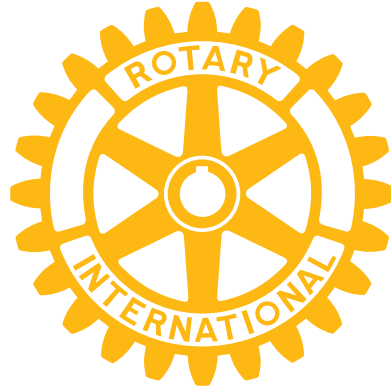
