This week we welcome many of our RYLA family to join us and get to know us. Please make yourself known to both candidates and their families so that the can be assured of the support available to them everywhere.



For others rostered to toast various Rotary Clubs at future meetings, all that is necessary is to propose a toast to said club, and optionally to Rotary International: no need to read the entire history of the club; that is what the Hub article is for!

PP Ken Allen reported that **Rtn Surinder Joson** has moved into a nursing home in Gladesville, and can provide the address to members wishing to visit him.

Kalma read several replies to our past Rotary Club Birthday cards from clubs as far afield as Scotland and Korea. She sat down just in time to stand again with the winning spackle ticket, and, failing the Joker test, chose a Vin Blanc as consolation prize. **Serjeant Patrick** fined **me** for my Club Anniversary last Wednesday (actually my 26th Wedding Anniversary, but for Patrick a triumph of factual accuracy) and fined others for their anniversaries, having grandchildren, smiling in our meeting or even for being quiet: it was a reign of terror!

Alexander Nilsen was introduced by Rtn David Johnston: hailing from Norway, he wandered the world until he married a Kiwi and settled in Sydney, and is a fan of ancient Chinese culture, which is how he came to be promoting the Shen Yun performing Arts. His presentation covered 5000 years of Chinese culture based on Lao Tzu's Tao, the teachings of Confucius and Buddhism, all of which was laid waste by the Cultural Revolution under Chairman Mao. The presentation was thankfully light on the Falun Gong political material this year, and considered as dance rather than as political protest, Shen Yun performances look impressive.



Alexander played a video of Shen Yun dancers whose technical skill was exceeded only by their athleticism. It was a physically impressive display of dance and agility.

BOWELCARE UPDATE

I am sure all members of our Club were saddend to hear of the death of Walter Leijten who died on the 10th December 2014.

Walter was the indefatigable co-ordinator of the Rotary District 9685 BowelCare (originally called Bowelscan) project and a member of the Rotary Club of East Gosford.

This programme I believe is a fine example of what can be achieved by one Rotary member with the assistance of their Club and then District. This simple test saved the lives of many people by early detection that had no indication of possible internal problems. This programme has been running for the past 25 years. I believe our Club has been involved every year since its inception.

Walter had tried on many occasions to try and obtain a simpler test and involving less Rotarians but I am pleased to announce this year the introduction a new bowel screening test (FIT). The Australian made (Immunochemical test) The test is a brush based test and is very easy to use, requires no faecal samples, and there no dietary or medication restrictions

When participants complete their test they will mail the sample card back to the pathology laboratory in the pre-addressed envelope provided with the kit. Results are received within 14 days. The extension of the pharmacy sales has been extended to 8 weeks, From Saturday 2nd May to Saturday 27th June.

Collection by Rotary members twice a week from the pharmacies (no collection pathology bin) will be necessary.

Unfortunately the cost of the new kit is now \$15.

Bowel cancer is one of the most common forms of cancer in Australia. Around 80 Australians die each week from the disease. Research shows a simple screening test can save up to 500 lives annually. If detected early bowel cancer can be treated successfully.
