

Our satellite E-Club meets via teleconference at **8:30am each Wednesday**, and members may participate at any time (alternatively or additionally) via the on-line forum accessible by clicking the "Forum" link on the E-Club webpage.

A well attended event at Muirfield Golf Course provided a great networking forum for all our district Presidents. The prime business was to accept an adjustment to the organization of the district clubs which are currently divided into zones. Recent events and circumstances have shown that best use of resources and collaboration can be gained by pulling together the resources of club zones in close proximity, and so the District will now have 5 Clusters. Ryde, as part of the Riverside zone, will be in Cluster 1 along with clubs in The Hills, Northern District and Northwestern zones. This provides a more management reference to areas and provides representation on a geographic basis.

We also received an animated updated on the End Polio campaign from Rob Byrne, who many will have seen at the Conference. He reports that Afghanistan has reported only 1 case this year, leaving only Pakistan, however even their reported cases are down from 258 (2013) to 58 (2014) to just 52 now. Even then there has been only 1 case out of Karachi as a result of city density, and it could realistically be the very last one! For a while it was difficult to provide vaccination in tribal areas, however while 250 000 were unvaccinated last year, this is down to 48 000 who are inaccessible this year, with reducing resistance on religious grounds.

DG Ian provided a timely reminder about Foundation giving, and encouraged all members to consider contributions throughout the year, rather than waiting until June to make a difference – even considering quarterly or half-yearly contributions can make a difference to the machinations of the funding equation.

ROTARIANS RUNNING FOR CANCER RESEARCH & END POLIO NOW

This weekend, **PDG John Dodd, Rtn Pat Mahony and Rtn Kathryn Dodd** of Ryde Rotary will be running **a combined 100km** in the Great Ocean Road Running Festival.

Our thanks to the members of Ryde Rotary for their wonderful support throughout the training season, attending our fundraising events and being appreciative of the effort we have put in!

No matter what happens on Saturday for PDG John's 6km race, and on Sunday for Pat and Kathryn in the Ultra Marathon, it's great to have the Club behind us and to know that we have raised over \$6000 for research grants to young Australian



cancer researchers, and thanks to Ryde Rotary, a further \$2000 to Polio Plus.

We look forward to reporting our success in a couple of weeks!

As usual the meeting kicked off with grace, followed by **Ken Allen** proposing the toast. This week we toasted the **Rotary Club of Port Harcourt, Nigeria**. Although a relatively young club, it is now the largest club in Nigeria.

President Kalma welcomed guests Felix Morlock and the night's speaker, Phillip Brown from Neighbourhood Watch. There was correspondence to announce as well: the club had received a letter from Kelvin, our sponsored student at the School of St Jude in Tanzania.



David James announced that with lightning speed the club had responded to the call out the week before following the earthquake in Nepal. With donations from club members and money in the club accounts, enough had been raised for **three Shelterboxes**. A wonderful reflection of the club, it highlighted beautifully Rotary's decisive action.

Julie Thorp took to the lectern, and began by observing 'How good is Janelle Dodd?' Janelle had single-handedly organised the club's Mother's Day paraphernalia. Julie also reminded us that District Changeover is coming up on the 27 June - tickets are \$50. More importantly, male shoeboxes (with a separate lid) are required for the decorations. Please bring any along next week.

It was time for the Serjeant's session. **Tony Abboud** won the raffle, while **Hendo** and **Ken Allen** were fined for coming back (note that they had already been back for at least a week). After a few more fines, it was time for the guest speaker.



Ross Rocca introduced Phillip Brown, who has been involved with Neighbourhood Watch for many years. The area around Ryde has one of the lowest crime rates in Sydney, and it's hard to dispute that Neighbourhood Watch plays a role in this. While many thought that the Watch was dying away, Phillip showed that with hard work, effort and dedication they will continue to form an important part of the Ryde community.

Tony Abboud gave the vote of thanks, and another meeting was closed.
