



LAST WEEK AS RECALLED BY STEFAN SOJKA

In terms of Ryde Rotary events, this was your typical, run-of-the-mill, yet strangely compelling and remarkable night. Yours truly was only a few minutes late in terms of being the official welcomer and by then almost everyone had already arrived, but not as late as the other official welcomer, Allen Horrell who was a big no-show in terms of turning up at all.

In terms of guests, we welcomed, from **Brisbane Airport Rotary, Mike van Hessing**, who surprised us all in terms of letting us know the high rate and attendance in terms of membership of a club one would expect would garner little interest in terms of airport staff, customs, AFP and other potential members that might be available to attend meetings in terms of their unpredictable schedules. There was some consolation for him, though, in terms of looking forward to seeing his family after all these months away.

Substitute Sergeant (and self appointed substitute welcomer) John Brown dished out a healthy serving in terms of fines. Swati Maheshwari then introduced **Dr Robyn Iredale**, president of the Fragile X Association of Australia. Dr Robyn is a local girl who discovered Fragile X by its impact on her own family and kids. Fragile X is a remarkably unknown yet relatively common genetic condition where some people can be carriers of the gene and have no impact, but through reproduction can manifest the condition in their children. The effects of Fragile X are many and varied, including intellectual



impairment, ADHA, autistic-type behaviours, tactile defensiveness, depression and aggression, hand tremors even early menopause in females. There is a diagnostic test, because it is genetic, but event doctors are often unaware of the condition, let alone their patients who are struggling with their afflicted kids.

Dr Robyn has been on an inspirational journey with her own son and shared some touching stories and insights into the life of a Fragile X family. Her presentation was received extremely well with great questions following the talk and a heartwarming 'thank you' delivered by **David Johnston**, as he presented her with a "Humanity in Motion" book as a thank you gift.

Another excellent Ryde Rotary evening in terms of ending, it did. In terms of next week, **PP Allen Horrell** will no doubt be back and help raise the standard of this report in terms of the incorrect use of the phrase "in terms of", which, in terms of overuse seems to be a major issue these days.
