

LAST WEEK AS RECALLED BY PAT MAHONY

President Victoria opened the meeting with a warm and welcoming break from tradition: "G'day!" **Ken Allen** proposed the toast to Rotary International, and to the **Rotary Club of Bendigo**, which celebrated its 90th birthday on the 30 July. Guests this week included exchange student **Violette Rohart**, guest speaker **Theo Glockemann**, and President of Eastwood Rotary Club, **Narelle Barker**. Narelle gave us a little snapshot of their small but highly active and dedicated club.

John Higgins received his Centurion Pin from President Victoria, and **Adrian Hallett** filled us in on the 'Racism: It Stops With Me" barbecue the club put on for Ryde Council last weekend. There was an impressive turn up, with many Rotarians lending a hand. The Council was grateful for the contribution, and thanked the club for their support.

John Brown reminded everyone to pay for the dinner at the TAFE on 11 August, while yours truly announced that nominations for RYLA 2016 have opened. If you know any young people aged 18-26 who might benefit from a week long leadership seminar, please nominate them!

Martin Aston read out some correspondence from **Patrick Longfield**. Patrick's vision is slowly on the mend, and recent investigations by neurologists have revealed an arteriovenous malformation (abnormal blood vessels) that will require surgery. Hopefully Patrick's recovery will continue and he will be back with us soon.

Violette then gave her report. Despite being a little under the weather, she had managed to pack a lot into one week. She started school, and already seems to be settling into a very different school life to that she experienced back home in France.

President Victoria then read out some thank you letters she had received from **Brighter Futures** and **Riding for the Disabled**, two of the charities that the club has donated money to recently.

It was now time for Serjeant-at-Arms **Duncan Taylor** to take control of proceedings. In what many will perceive as a suspicious result, the winner of the raffle turned out to be... the serjeant himself! Thankfully the Joker was not drawn this week, as the pile grows smaller and smaller.

After another raucous fines session, **Burkhart Foertsch** introduced the guest speaker. **Theo Glockemann** has been a Rotarian for many years, and was instrumental in implementing the first RYLA program to run in East Timor. For a nation traumatised by war, the ability to train and develop young people into future leaders takes on an even greater level of importance.

Starting in 2007, the program now attracts over 700 applicants for only 100 places in the program. RYLA is only a beginning for many of these young people: after attending RYLA, alumni have started their own community projects as well as six Rotaract clubs. Already, 160 alumni have been able to secure full time jobs or scholarships for further education. The success of RYLA led to the development of RYPEN programs in East Timor as well, which have proved to be just as popular.

Theo thanked Ryde Rotary, and **PDG Les Whitcroft** in particular, for providing support to East Timor RYLA from its early days. After an engaging and inspiring talk (which due to technical difficulties was done without slides), **Nora Etmekdjian** led the Vote of Thanks.

With the singing of the national anthem, the meeting was closed.
