Well it's a note from Julie again. Victoria was at the meeting but she was not feeling well so asked if I would step into her shoes again.



eSAT RYDE PRESENTS THE CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY AWARD

On September 9, District Governor Gina Growden presented the Ryde Rotary Satellite e-Club's inaugural Ethics in Business award.

In this first year the award recognised outstanding Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR). DG Gina presented the award to Daryll Harkness, representing Johnson and

Johnson Medical.

J&J is a well-known company that has for many years extolled CSR as a fundamental part of its organisational credo.

Their commitment to CSR is expressed in many vital activities in Australia and around the world.

Particularly noteworthy is J&J's support for the very remote aboriginal community at Kintore, in the Western Desert several hundred kilometres west of Alice Springs.



The presentation was made at a breakfast organised by Ryde Business Forum, at which many presenters discussed various aspects of CSR and how it helps individuals, communities, and the companies involved. MC at the breakfast was our own Stefan Sojka.

Other members of the Ryde Rotary Satellite e-Club at the meeting were David James, Bob Kay-Smith and John Hepworth. E-Club Chair Rob Mitchell was unable to be physically present as he was overseas, but he was virtually present in true e-Club style in the form of a pre-recorded video welcome.

For reasons that were never made clear, **PE Julie** was acting President, while **President Victoria** sat in her old place on the naughty table. Julie made a fair fist of it, announcing visitors, absences and anniversaries like a pro. The meal came and went and conversations flourished until Julie brought them to a halt with a mighty "SHOOSH!" before reading several messages. **PP Martin Aston** has jaundice and had a stent fitted today, and expects to be at next week's meeting. PP Geoff talked up the Rotary Foundation and encouraged us to become Centurions at the very least, and then auctioned off two tickets to "Les Mis" with proceeds to TRF.

PP Adrian reported back on the Ryde Eisteddfod last Saturday, and spoke of an opportunity to help in the fight against Huntington's disease, by feeding the campaigners at a BBQ on Sunday 27th September - Huntington's Disease Association West Ryde has come back to us however, that they have too many volunteers so we can have a weekend off!

John Brown thanked all the Father's Day rest home visitors then sold off all the leftover pensioners' socks to the club members, to recoup our community funds. Nothing goes to waste at Ryde Rotary (except the odd Spackle card)!

Violette spoke on her week: **The Halletts** took her to Kiama to see a blowhole in action, on Saturday she and some other Exchange Students went to the Harbour Bridge and Darling Harbour and enjoyed the stunning views. On Sunday Violette enjoyed **PP Steve Thorp**'s Father's Day with his family. Under cross-examination she admitted that she had slept through her Chemistry exam, because she could not understand the questions due to her petit vocabulaire!

I received Emily, a real aussie from the Blue Mountains. She arrived in my house in January 2015 and stayed there until April 2015. She'll back at the end of her exchange in december. I am really close to both of my host sisters and they are now part of the Rohart Family. I consider both of them as reals sisters.



I only have my mother's parents. They are 85 and 88 but both of them are really healty and energetic. I really nice to see them like that!

I am the godmother of a 3 years old named Mathilde. She's the daughter of my godfather who is also my cousin. I don't see them as much as I would like to, especially now that I am in Australia! To finish with the Rohart family, I have a cat named Papaye. She is 11.
