Julie also announced the sad passing of **PP George Bouckley**, whom was known by many in the Club.



Julie announced the birthdays and anniversaries. Likely an explanation for absent **PP Burkhart Foertsch**, Patricia Foertsch was celebrating a birthday on this fine evening. A warm congratulations was also given to PP **Bill Payne** and **Val Payne** on their 65th wedding anniversary. A combination of kindness, love and Rotary must be the secret! Julie also delightfully 39th announced her wedding anniversary and surprisingly, she also announced it for **PP Stephen Thorp**. A delicious meal of capsicum and a side of chicken was then served and enjoyed around the room.

PP Noel Dunn was then called to the front for his 300 second vocational talk. Once Noel completed school in Granville, he received a pre-apprentice opportunity and elected to study a mechanical trade for four years from 1947. On Thursday night, he organised a trampolining night with his fellow Venturers. Naturally, they all arrived perfectly on time. Over the weekend, Simen took part in: gift wrapping and pizza eating with the Thorps, Norwegian gingerbread baking, an afternoon of Ikea shopping with "Phillip", a trip to the hospital, and a dinner organised by Rotex. George Bouckley joined the Rotary Club of Ryde in November 1976 with a classification of Education Technical. George was soon involved with the running of the Club.

In 1980-81 George was inducted as President of the Rotary Club of Ryde. He announced to the Club that the major project for year was to be the building of four self-contained residential units at the Ryde District Hospital. The completed Rotary Lodge marked a significant milestone in our Club's ongoing assistance to Ryde Hospital and the Ryde Community.

George decided that a cash for aluminium can collection centre would be a new source of fundraising, and Ryde Council agreed to the setting up of a Saturday morning Can Collection Centre in a corner of Ryde Park. This ongoing activity not only raised money but became a great source of fellowship for the Rotarians rostered on duty.

In 1988 George was awarded Rotary's highest Honour, a Paul Harris Fellowship Award in recognition of his contribution to the Community. When George retired from the Club he was awarded an Honorary Membership; an honour he held to the end,

George left a legacy to the Club in achieving two milestones in the history of our club; the Rotary Lodges at Ryde Hospital and the Cash for Cans Project which ran for close on 20 years.

George passed away peacefully on December 8th aged 97.

A memorial service for George Bouckley will be held at St Peters Presbyterian Church on the corner of Blue Street and Miller Street, North Sydney. The service will be on Tuesday December 20th at 11:30 am.
