



His presentation showed graphically that Rotary Membership worldwide is stable, in Australia is falling, but in Ryde club is growing! He attributed our growth over the last five years against the trend to the fact that we had acquired five members from the former Rydalmere club. I informed him later that while we appreciate the five very good Rotarians from Rydalmere, our rise from 33 to 47 members over that period cannot be entirely due to that fact, but it did increase the angle of our trend line. Club extension is all about growing Rotary by opening new clubs at places and meeting times that are currently not catered for. He is keen for us to start a morning coffee club to meet 8am-9am at Top Ryde, and would be happy for us to use his Hobby Sew café for this purpose. He also suggested that Rotary Clubs can be formed around hobbies or interests and indicated that if Duncan's Men's Shed was to charter as a Rotary Club, it would qualify for a District funding grant to help set it up. He revealed that his Greater Sydney e-club has no geographic boundaries and has 5 members from overseas. He also spruiked his "Humanity in Motion" 2nd Edition, and asked us to get it into Doctor's waiting rooms. DGE John Dodd then volunteered as a second guest speaker and nearly matched Duncan's effort from last week in his affirmation of Tony's presentation.

Eventually **David Johnston** managed to take the microphone for the official vote of thanks, and after the Anthem we were off into the storm to make our way home.

Eric Bond ... 50 Years' Service to Rotary

n 28 March 1961, President Ron Pacey inducted Eric Bond into the Rotary Club of Ryde. Therefore, on 28 March this year, PP Eric completed 50 years of Rotary service with us. Till then, only Charter Member PP Ron Pacey had completed the longest period of Ryde service – 47 years.

Before I mention some of Eric's Rotary accomplishments, I would like to outline a few of his career achievements. At his retirement it was said no other individual has contributed more to the combined interest of the wheat, flour and bread industries, as well as cereal chemistry, than Eric. Professional associations and positions held include:

- Fellow, Royal Australian Chemical Institute
- Fellow, Australian Institute of Food Science and Technology
- 1951 Foundation Chairman, Cereal Chemistry Division, Royal Australian Chemical Institute
- 1970-72 President of the International Association for Cereal Chemistry
- 1979-82 Chairman, National Association for Cereal Chemistry
- 1982 onwards Honorary Governor, Nutrition Research Foundation, University of Sydney
- ... and from 1982 onwards,
- Honorary Membership of British Flour Milling and Baking Research Association

During those hectic years, Eric received various awards:

- 1971 Order of the British Empire
- 1971 Farrer Medal for distinguished service to Agricultural Science
- 1980 Guthrie Medal for meritorious service to Cereal Chemistry

Naturally, such a busy life required many

overseas trips. But Eric did not allow these to interfere with his Rotary service. Instead, if anything, he intensified his Ryde Rotary involvement. After many Chairmanships and Directorships, he became President in 1976-77. This, of course, meant being Conference Chairman for DG Les Whitcroft. And what a successful conference it was! One pressure year was not enough for PP Eric. When circumstances required it, Eric accepted the presidency for 1983-84 at short notice. He was the first Ryde President to serve a second year.

Since then PP Eric has served the Club with distinction in many fields. Three of these deserve special mention. For many years in Vocational Service, Eric has chaired the interviewing panel to select Apprentice/Trainee of the Year Awards. The standards he set impressed everyone who served on that panel. Secondly, Eric enhanced the value of our "Hub" by introducing a roster for service directors to report on the work of their committees. Eric followed up his roster by personally checking that directors had submitted reports in time for "Hub" printing. Then, again, he used his great leadership skills to set up another Probus Club in Ryde. Merely three aspects of full dedication to Rotary and to Ryde Club. Recognition came with a PHF in 1987 and a Sapphire Pin in 1994.
