

ur meeting to celebrate the 107th Birthday of Rotary was ably marked by PDG **Alex Sawyer's** toast to RI. He demonstrated that he still has the words appropriate to the occasion and the voice to deliver a speech without the aid of a microphone!

Ken regaled us with statistics about 1905 USA: 47 years was the life expectancy, only 40% of homes had their own bath, only 8000 cars existed at the time, and Australia's population was less than 4 million. PP **Geoff** was later to point out how much better off we are with over 1 billion cars on the road today!

There was a letter from PP **Duncan** on behalf of the Hunter's Hill-Ryde Men's Shed – at last we have a local Ryde Charity the club can adopt to support.

We have been invited by Gladesville Local Area Command to sell soft-drink and crisps at the Gladesville Blue Light Disco in June, a project which, given the age group, I think is ideally suited to Rotaract, rather than Rotary involvement.

Nora spruiked the Mayor's Big Bash Cricket charity day in support of the "Touched by Olivia" Foundation's drive to build a "Livvi's Place" multi-abled playground in Yamble Reserve.

Bill Scan the Bowel Payne man pointed out that Ryde has a proud record with Bowel Scan, and this year will distribute 800 kits, the third-largest group in the District. Who knows how many lives we have saved by the early detection of this deadly disease?

President Ken thanked PP Geoff Brennan for the RI Birthday cake which we then consumed while watching Exchange Student Victoria Blichfeldt's slide show of her tour of Sydney CBD on Saturday with Rtn Maureen Mulheron. The highlight of the show was the slide of an exhausted Victoria, walked off her feet by Maureen, asleep on the train on their way home.

The fines session included **David Johnston's** West Ryde sleep-walk past PP Allen and his family on Sunday. It was Founder Tom Henderson's idea that the Shelterbox tents must be big enough for the whole family and to last for years in all weather. In Haiti, many are still living in
